HOSHINOYA Bali overlooks the Pakerisan river, with sacred water canals running through the property, part of the island's age-old water temple network recognized as a UNESCO World Heritage Landscape.

The surrounding dense rainforest and terraced rice paddies as well as the extended mountain range are among one of Bali's most famous landscapes. The beautiful land provides the ultimate freshair vacation, but also the landscape dotted with Bali Hindu temples and shrines offers a spiritual atmosphere to the visitor. The Subak irrigation system, which was the first to be nominated in Bali as a UNESCO World Heritage site, has supported

the rice terraced field and Ubud's water network system for over 1,000 years. HOSHINOYA Bali provides the perfect relaxation experience, allowing guests to feel in true harmony among the nature, people and God of Bali.

In HOSHINOYA Bali, we offer an exclusive and comfortable alternative to hotels. Our villas provide a private, luxury residence for our guests. We offer 3 types of luxury villas all connecting with the semi-private pool area allowing the guest to descend from the terrace of their villa. 1.Villa Bulan

Peace and quiet pervade this villa's second-floor bedroom, which opens up to a colorful garden terrace. The first-floor poolside living area, meanwhile, encourages a more lively sense of fun. Here, time will fly by as guests make the most of their waterside location—whether by enjoying the southern breeze, sunbathing or occasionally dipping their feet into the cooling waters.

2. Villa Soka

Bright sunlight enters the combined bedroom and study located on the second floor of these maisonettes. The first floor living room includes a section that juts out over the pool—a relaxing space that offers direct access to the water and is surrounded by a lovingly crafted garden. These villas are best suited to long stays and groups of four.

3. Villa Jalak

Cafes in the sky


